

Charlie, a senior in high school, came to the Home as a homeless teen. Charlie had his permit for two years, but did not have the opportunity to obtain his full license. After arriving at the Home, he finally had the opportunity for someone to encourage and teach him, help him locate the necessary documents, provide a car and take him to complete his driving test. All of the hard work paid off as he passed the test on the first try and now has his license to drive!

Children's Attention Home Nationally Accredited

As part of the Children's Attention Home's ongoing commitment to providing the best care to the children we serve, the Board of Directors and leadership team decided to pursue national accreditation with the Council on Accreditation (COA). COA is an independent non-profit and industry leader in human service accreditation. They partner with human service organizations across the country and around the world to implement best practices according the type of an organization's service. We are thrilled to inform you that in November, 2017, the Children's Attention Home achieved this national accreditation status.

The rigorous process included the development, refinement, and review of organizational policies and procedures and extensive staff interviews. When presented with all of the information, COA's peer review team found substantial evidence to demonstrate effective

management and best practices in place at the Home. As a result, the Children's Attention Home received an expedited accreditation.



We are proud of our COA accreditation and the quality of care delivery and outcomes it represents. The designation also ensures the Home will continue to be held to the highest standards of best practice going forward. *Our children, and our community, deserve nothing less.*

Service Impact

Residential Program

Every child that comes to the Home receives individualized care, compassionate support, and loving attention to help them heal from their past and reach their potential. Through individualized assessment, a unique plan is developed for every child that coordinates instruction, life experiences, and mentoring to prepare them on their path to success. For whatever amount of time we have with a child, we provide support in key areas through our comprehensive care plan:

EDUCATION:

Equipping children to succeed in the classroom through the optimal school placement, participation in tutoring, and ongoing academic support.

INDEPENDENT LIVING:

Empowering youth ages 13-21 with the skills they need to transition to independence and lead successful lives.



SOCIAL DEVELOPMENT:

Enabling children to relate to others effectively and contribute in positive ways in family, school and the community.

SELF-CARE:

Establishing healthy habits in all aspects of daily living that nurture a child's overall health and well-being

Activities & Child Life Experiences

Children experience many firsts with us. Beyond daily care, the Home provides unique life experiences that expose children to new ideas and opportunities. Some of these include going to science museums, theater productions, trips to Myrtle Beach and Atlanta, weekly after-school activities such as horseback riding, music lessons and team sports, and celebrating birthdays and holidays.



Outcomes:

Quality of Life: In January of 2017, the Home began monitoring the quality of life of children and youth by surveying the kids themselves. In addition to asking them how they feel about living at the Home, our team talks with them about their responses to gain clarity on how we can better serve them. **Since beginning this process, their level of satisfaction has increased from a rating of 66% to 97% in less than one year!**

Service Project Participation: In 2017, the Home increased the frequency and level of participation in service projects to teach children to consider the needs of others and give back to their community. **Now, nearly all children participate in a monthly service project, going from 32% to 98% in just one year!**

Medical Exams: To better serve and improve the overall medical care of the children, the Home expanded the network of doctors available to see our children after they first arrive at the Home. **This coordination of service has increased the Home's ability to respond to a child's medical needs and decreased the time to complete a child's physical from 14 days to 5 days.**



The Home has an extraordinary team delivering high quality care to every child we serve. At the end of the day, teamwork is the name of the game, and we are only as effective as the people who serve here every day.

To ensure our team is equipped and empowered to give our children the best care possible, we also work to better serve our teammates, who work diligently to provide every child with compassionate care. Through focused feedback collected in teammate surveys and our Teammate Satisfaction team, we identified ways to invest in the growth of our team, such as:

- Increased training opportunities at all levels
- Increased recognition and appreciation for great work done every day
- Increased opportunities for advancement

It takes special people to be there for our kids daily and give them the great care they deserve. Thank you for the life changing work you make possible every day!

OUTCOME:

While making these improvements, our team faced significant challenges with an influx of older residents and increased expectations to meet the accreditation standards. Despite these challenges, our teammate satisfaction ratings are at an all time high of 91%, up from 86% in early 2016.

Michael

At age 15 years old, Michael had only advanced to the 7th grade due to the amount of school he had missed while suffering from physical neglect in his home environment.

He was bullied in school and grew to hate going. After arriving at the Home, he was placed at the Palmetto School at the Children's Attention Home, where he could attend smaller class sizes along with the friends he made in his cottage. He is now working hard to catch up and is excited to go to school! When asked about his experience, Michael said, "I struggled in math before, and here at the Home, it's easier. I can focus because there aren't that many people at my school."



Serving Homeless Youth

Launched in February 2017, Crossroads serves homeless teens ages 16-21 in our community and surrounding areas. With nowhere else to turn and no one to depend on, these youth face incredible challenges and dangers. Finding a place to sleep and something to eat can turn into trusting the wrong person, selling themselves for survival, and facing limited opportunities to learn the life skills they need to be successful long term.

Crossroads allows a teen to stay for up to 2 years to be equipped with the resources, connections and life skills he or she needs to be successful and break the cycle of homelessness. By removing the worry of shelter and other basic needs, teens are able to focus and invest in their future personally, academically and professionally.

When Isaac first arrived at the Home as a homeless teen, he planned to stay through the summer and then head to California. He was shy and withdrawn, no bank account, no job and nowhere to turn. After working with our team, Isaac has learned to communicate more confidently, now has a job and bank account, and recently earned his learner's permit to drive! After 8 months, he now plans to stay for at least one more year to make sure he is well prepared for life on his own. When asked about what the Home means to him, Isaac stated, "The best thing about the Children's Attention Home is that they provide you with what you need and try to understand you. I consider it like my family. They really care about us. They have a lot of experience, and the staff help you. I'm really thankful for it because I know that I can really meet my goals."



Community Support

Volunteers

Our volunteers are a vital part of making our mission possible every day. While literally hundreds of volunteers serve on the front lines, we are blessed to have those willing to work behind the scenes. This year, we set out on a journey to match skilled volunteers in indirect roles, from administrative and financial assistants, to food service and maintenance help.

Volunteers with our Administrative Team assist with a variety of tasks from data entry to special events, serving 817 hours.




