
### At the Children's Attention Home, we go beyond the basics.


Executive Director

# Before I came to the home, I had experienced physical abuse, sexual abuse, and neglect in my life. My needs were not being taken care of. I was a mother to my own mother. I lived with other people which was not stable. I was not going to school much at all. When I came to the Home, I really wanted a job so I can have money of my own. I had never worked a real job before. I did not have an ID or Social Security Card to get a job with. At the Children's Attention Home, I was able to get my birth certificate and social security card so I could get an ID. I was able to get a job with Firehouse Subs. I really like working there. My manager, Ms. Cindy, is a great lady who really understands what I am going through, and works with my school schedule. I have taken on more leadership at work. I have opened a bank account and am saving money. I am looking forward to going to college, but I know I will always have to work to support myself. This first job has given me a work history I can build on for the future.


### Residential Program

Every child deserves a safe and nurturing home. The team at the Home is dedicated to ensuring the children receive the individual care they need to help them heal and place on a path to success. As the average ages of the children continued to increase this past year, the Home adapted accordingly, providing relevant programming, resources, and instruction.


Each child has unique needs, abilities, and goals. Residents are involved in the development of their comprehensive care plan, which addresses:

- Self-care and healthy daily living
- Education assessment and support
- Independent living and life skills training
- Social development and healthy relationships

### Outcomes:

Quality of Life: Throughout the year, the Home monitors the children's quality of life by surveying the kids and talking with them about their responses to understand how we can better serve them. With a goal of an 85% satisfaction rating, we are at 92%!

Workforce Readiness: With many of our youth being working age, we work diligently

to help them with employment through helping obtain necessary documents, providing transportation, and teaching them about the employment environment. This year, 21 kids obtained or maintained employment!

**Education:** To prepare them for better life opportunities, our team works diligently to help our kids achieve their educational potential. This year, 13 youth received their high school diploma or GED!

# Crossroads

The Crossroads program has continued to grow and serve youth in desperate need of safe and reliable shelter. As **the only long-term program for homeless youth in this region**, the Home wraps around these youth with the loving care and resources they need to become successful, independent adults.

This year, residents in the Crossroads program have:

- Completed GED's
- Entered higher education and certification programs
- Obtained driver's permits and licenses
- Purchased their own vehicles
- Become gainfully employed

### Program FAQ's

### Who does Crossroads serve?

The Crossroads provides a safe and nurturing home to youth who are homeless or without safe and reliable shelter. These youth face struggles similar to youth in foster care - destructive home and family life, lack of basic resources, and lack of dedicated attention to their growth and development.



### Why is this program needed?

Studies estimate that at least 20% of youth in foster care become homeless after transitioning out of the custody of the state. Additionally, many older youth fall through the cracks of the social service system, and the Crossroads program exists to help fill this gap by providing extended support to youth 17-20.

### **Outcome**

This year, the Home provided 15 youth from both North and South Carolina with resources and support to navigate next steps from homelessness to independence.

Before I came to the Home, I was homeless with no stability, my family was abusive. I was in school but could not actually go to school because I had to work and support myself. I was living in Charlotte and knew that I needed help. That's when I came to the Children's Attention Home. The Children's Attention Home has given me the ability to focus on one thing at a time. I can attend school and do not have to worry about how I am going to survive. I can attend school, work and save money because I have a stable place to live. I am almost finished with my GED and am looking forward to more school that will allow me to enter into college. My future is bright.



Before we came to the home our family had arguments, physical conflicts, and lots of mixed emotions. Since we have been at the home we have learned more responsibility like cleaning, time management, and balance for things. We have become more social and made friends. We live in the same cottage and we get to spend a lot of time together. We had a lot of conflicts between us but now we have learned to talk through it. The Children's Attention Home has helped us prioritize the goals we would like to accomplish. Family is very important to both of us and this has brought us closer. We look forward in the future to spending many holidays together.

The kids learned about life skills and the inner workings of businesses across industries through tours and interactive experiences.


