




# Callie

**Callie came to the Home because of neglect.** In her words, she and her siblings “basically did whatever [they] wanted, when [they] wanted” because of her parents’ addiction to drugs and alcohol. Adjusting to structured life at the Home proved challenging. After a year, Callie left to live with a foster family. However, just a year later, Callie asked to return to the Home, where she knew she would receive the support she needed from our team. With the education resources the Home provided, Callie became the first in her family to pass the 10th grade and earn her high school diploma. **She now attends college studying early childhood education with the hopes of reaching the young children just like herself in need of someone to believe in them.**

## Dallas

*Dallas arrived at the Home suffering significant challenges in verbal and written comprehension due to severe neglect. He struggled communicating with others, and his mounting frustration led to daily outbursts and destructive behavior. Through the dedicated efforts of our staff, therapy, and tremendous effort, Dallas was able to reduce these episodes from daily to monthly at most. As he improved managing and coping with his learning disability, his grades in school improved, he was able to participate on his school's football and basketball teams, and he made friends. **After three years, Dallas was like a big brother to many of the boys in his cottage, and became a leader and example for others to follow.***

- **Self-care** and healthy daily living
- **Education** assessment and support
- **Independent** living and life skill training
- **Social development** and healthy relationships

### Outcomes:

**Quality of Life:** Since January of 2017, the Home has monitored the children's quality of life. Information is gathered by surveying the kids and talking with them about their responses to gain clarity on how we can better serve them. **With a goal of an 85% satisfaction rating, we are at 91%!**

**Youth Advisory Committee Launched:** To stay attuned to the changing needs of the children in care, a youth advisory committee was established. Three youth, age 13+ and nominated by their peers and teammates, attend monthly meetings with our Residential Services Director and three teammates to discuss resident suggestions for improvement.

## Serving Homeless Youth

**Crossroads launched in February 2017 to serve youth ages 17-20 who are homeless or without safe and reliable shelter.** Similar to youth in foster care, these youth face dismal home and family environments, lack basic resources, and need holistic support to move from surviving to thriving. **As the only long-term program for homeless youth in this region,** the Home wraps around these youth with the loving care and resources they need to become successful, independent adults.

**Outcome:** In the program's first year, the Home helped 11 youth from both North and South Carolina navigate next steps from homelessness to independence.

## Charity

*Charity arrived at the end of March 2017 after two years of no consistent place to stay. Her father had kicked her out and told her she would never graduate. She walked to and from work and school and was in danger of dropping out of high school to just survive. She arrived at the Home on a snowy night, where she was given a warm meal and bed. At first, she struggled with the structure the Home provided, but she came to appreciate the support as her grades improved. **After months of hard work, she walked across the stage, a high school graduate!** In the year since leaving the Home's care, she has capitalized on the independent living skills she learned, remained in stable housing, and maintained a full-time job.*

## Ellie

**Ellie arrived after suffering two diabetic emergencies caused by medical neglect.** Lacking the knowledge to manage her diabetes, she controlled her sugar levels with insulin instead of eating the right foods. Because of her medical struggles, Ellie remained homebound for school, limiting her access to quality instruction. While in our care, Ellie was taught how to count her carbohydrate intake, balance her carbs with the insulin she needed, and shop for the snacks and drinks she could safely enjoy. With her diabetes under control, Ellie was enrolled in a small public school with self-paced online classes. **With the help of the Home’s tutoring program, Ellie maintained straight A’s and was able to make friends at school for the first time.**

## Community Education Initiatives

For nearly 50 years, the Children’s Attention Home has cared for abused and neglected children with the dedicated support from the community. In an effort to share what we are learning and equip others with the knowledge to help, the Home launched the Community Education Initiative.

Utilizing agency partnerships, we create space for educational opportunities that are youth-specific and open them to the public. This past year we held the following training events:

- Human Trafficking Awareness – to understand the warning signs and help prevent human trafficking
- Youth Mental Health First-Aid – to teach the basic ways to assist in a mental health crisis
- Opioid Awareness – to understand the dangers and trends of opioid abuse and its connection and impact to the number of youth experiencing abuse, neglect, and homelessness

### The Homestretch



- Screening of The Homestretch - to create awareness and understanding about the challenges and realities of youth homelessness

### Human Trafficking Awareness



These quarterly trainings are geared to equip Children’s Attention Home teammates and educate our community at large about how to better help our youth. Expanding these learning opportunities will increase the awareness surrounding the issues that affect our youth the most.

**OUTCOME:** Through these events, the Home has educated over 100 community members, in addition to the teammates who attended.

Too many, however, lack ready access to strong, compassionate adult role models; that is why we are so very thankful for our reliable regulars who give of their time to invest in the lives of our children as Volunteer Mentors

Mentoring is a proven strategy to help transform the lives of children in need. Children who have a caring adult to guide them are more likely to stay in school, go to college, and stay away from drugs and alcohol.

They serve as role models to our children, and their faithful presence often makes a tremendous difference in the physical, emotional, mental, and spiritual development of their mentees. They help build self-esteem, develop character, and encourage learning and leadership skills; these faithful volunteers help to build better lives and a brighter future for our children.


## Events




